Notes: The first Super Rankings and Power Poll are always rough draft of sorts. So I expect to make some mistakes and have some controversy. Again, it would be great if all programs got their results on Track. Sometimes deserving kids don't get ranked because they are simply not on my radar. I try to be thorough in my research. 119 and 126 are simply loaded weight classes, 182 and 220 probably the weakest weight classes. But some of those lower middle weights are thick with competitors. 152 looks very strong too. It'll be interesting to see if McKay of Logan or Foy of Altamont can give Olympus' McBride a run for his money because right now I see McBride as the state's top wrestler, and because Olympus doesn't go out of state to compete this year, he's likely not to be challenged at all unless it is by Foy at the all-star dual or by McKay at Richardson.

In regards to the all-star dual and my rankings. Well, I was one of a six-member selection committee. I voice my opinion just like anyone else. These rankings are INDEPENDENT of the all-star committee selection for either the team or alternates. It is MY opinion based on results that I do receive or can research and I guess my gut feeling on other matters where no information can lead to a conclusive ranking.

Lastly, let me know for sure if I have a wrestler in the wrong weight or a name is wrong or misspelled. Results are always great. I do look at THIS year's results most of all and most recent match results get precedence. Again, letting me know results is good but as I have said, just remember sometimes when Wrestler A beats Wrestler B, he might have lost to Wrestler C who Wrestler B beat. This happens quite a bit and I usually know it where the casual fan does not. But again sometimes I do make mistakes and do want the
